AJA'S 2020 JAMAICA MEDICAL SUPPLY / SUPPORT INITIATIVE

This is the second in a series of updates providing examples of how the AJA Board and members continued to serve the community in 2020 despite the Covid-19 pandemic. This report provides an update on the AJA's Jamaica Medical Supply / Support Initiative, of which AJA member, Dr. Apollone Reid is the liaison.

AJA team members, Dr. Apollone Reid and Christine Marzouca, and Caribbean International Shipping Services' Sharon Mitchell-Barnwell and Gordon Barnwell, get items ready to be shipped.



Dr. Reid shared that:

- This was a continuation of an initiative that was started in 2016.
- This year's supplies were made possible with cash donations from the AJA, Marjorie Powell and Winnie Starke, in-kind contributions from Marcia Anderson-Esson, Tony Gray, Christine Marzouca, Dawnet Dunbar and others.
- Caribbean International Shipping Services very generously provided two barrels and free shipping to Jamaica.
- Delivery of the barrels of supplies in September were coordinated with the Southern Regional Health Authority (SRHA), which falls under Jamaica's Ministry of Health and Wellness.

The SRHA will make gift packages from the items shipped, and distribute to:

- The **Annual Men's Health Day** in Manchester, St. Elizabeth, and Clarendon, which is aimed at getting men to take responsibility for their health through prostate and other health checks done by a team of doctors and nurses. The items donated will make gift packages for rewarding those who attend this particular initiative.
- The **Curphey Home** state residence of 25 retired army veterans and 15 members of staff.
- The New Vision Children's Home in Colleyville, Manchester, home to 42 children ages 4 to 17-years old and 17 members of staff.
- Ebenezer Home for mentally ill and homeless men.
- Drivers and maintenance workers associated with the health system.
